DIYC is widely recognized as a premier sailing venue, with a longstanding tradition of hosting top-tier regattas. Our location offers easy access for international travelers, with Tampa International Airport just minutes away and Orlando's international hub a short drive to the north. Tampa Bay provides an ideal racing environment, and December offers sailors outstanding conditions—typically featuring steady breezes ranging from 10–18 knots, warm temperatures in the mid-70s°F (24–26°C), and mild, predictable weather patterns. While occasional cold fronts may bring a brief wind shift, they tend to stabilize quickly, offering exciting and competitive racing.

After two hurricanes struck our community just twelve days apart, Davis Island Yacht Club faced significant damage that led to extensive repairs and recovery work. Following major renovations that began in 2024 and continue today—including reclaiming 15 feet of shoreline lost to the storms and restoring our pool, patio, fire pit areas, and landscaping—we're proud to provide a resilient and welcoming venue that maintains our Green Marina status. After having to cancel last year's December event—the first race in the Winter Series hosted by DIYC since 2014—we were deeply moved by the generosity of our J/70 sailors. Their financial and emotional support helped sustain the Club and our staff through a very challenging time, and many have told us they think of DIYC as their "home away from home," their favorite club to visit, and like family to return to year after year.

Davis Island Yacht Club is known as the "Sailingest Club in the South," with a membership composed entirely of passionate sailors. Our unique "Do It Yourself" spirit is evident throughout our club, where members come together to maintain and improve our facilities, fostering a strong sense of camaraderie and pride. This same dedication and enthusiasm will be on full display as we host the J/70 North American Championship, ensuring an unforgettable experience both on and off the water.

Seating in the bar and dining areas is first-come, first-served, with reservations only needed for Friday dinners and special events. All purchases at the bar, dining room, and ship's store must be paid by credit card. Dining and bar hours are posted at the Club and on our website for your convenience.

We maintain a relaxed, sailor-friendly atmosphere—shirts and shoes are required, and wet bathing suits are not permitted inside the clubhouse. DIYC is a non-smoking club; however, smoking is permitted on the northwest corner of the upper porch.

We kindly ask that you bring your dishes and glassware to the bus station after your meal. Your help in keeping the Club clean is appreciated! DIYC is proud of its Green Marina status—we recycle and encourage you to bring reusable water bottles for you and your crew. Please use recycling containers whenever possible.

Pets are not allowed inside the clubhouse, on porches, or in the pool area unless they are certified service animals. Leashed pets are welcome in the Regatta Bar, on the Point, and around the docks and slips. Please clean up after them and keep them off furniture.

Please also be mindful that manatees occasionally visit our harbor. Support boat operators should stay alert and take care when maneuvering in the basin and surrounding waters. 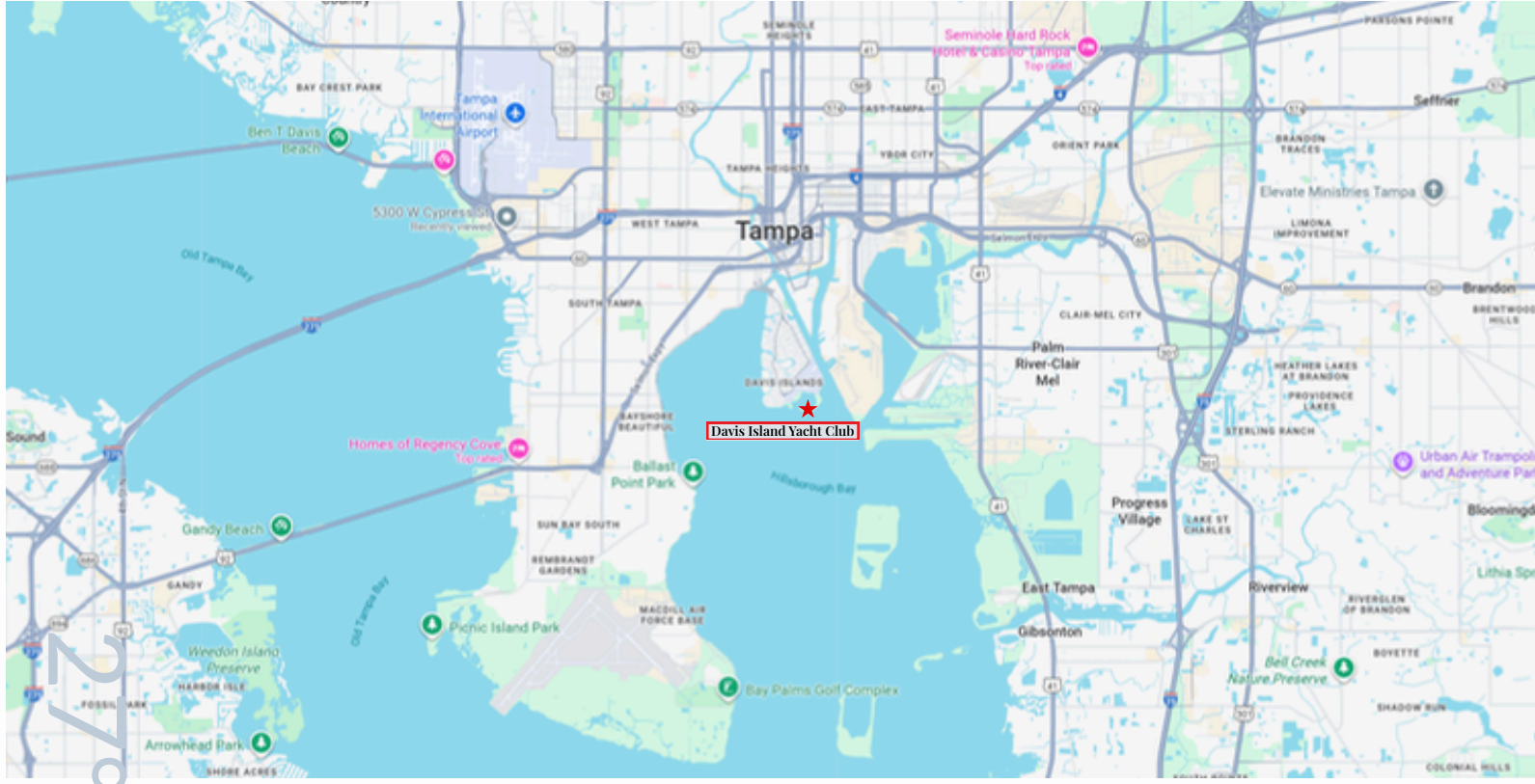

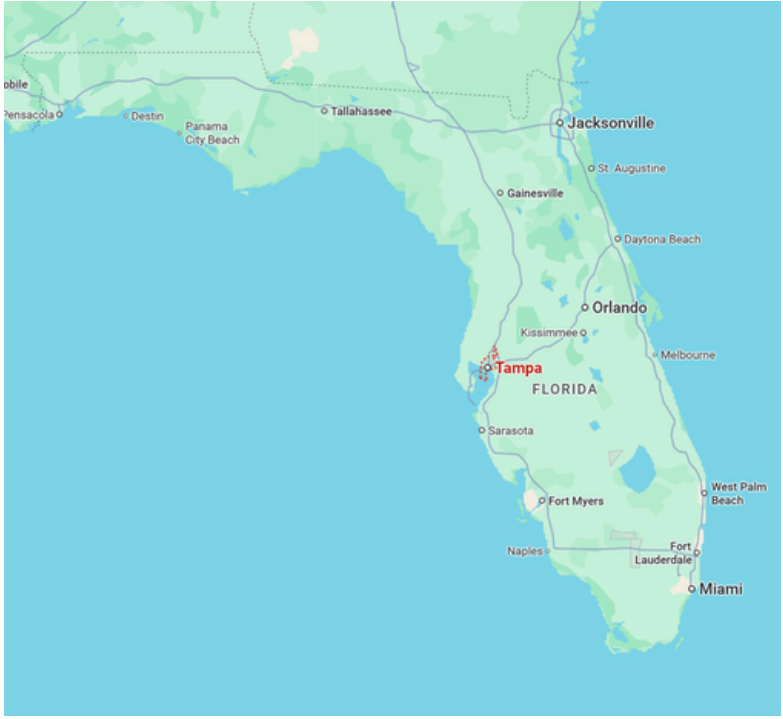

## Tampa: A Blend of Adventure & Culture

In Tampa, visit Busch Gardens, a world-class theme park featuring thrilling roller coasters and up-close animal encounters. For marine life enthusiasts, the Florida Aquarium offers hands-on experiences and a massive coral reef exhibit, while ZooTampa at Lowry Park is home to exotic animals and interactive wildlife experiences.

For a taste of Tampa's culture, explore the Tampa Riverwalk, a scenic waterfront path connecting top attractions like the Glazer Children's Museum, the Tampa Museum of Art, and the lively bars and restaurants at Armature Works. History lovers can visit Ybor City, Tampa's historic Cuban district, where you can tour a cigar factory, enjoy authentic Cuban cuisine, or ride the vintage streetcar to downtown. Sports fans can catch a Tampa Bay Lightning hockey game at Amalie Arena, a Buccaneers football game at Raymond James Stadium, or a Rays baseball game just across the bay in St. Petersburg.

## St. Petersburg: Arts, Beaches & Outdoor Fun

St. Pete offers the world-famous Dalí Museum, the scenic St. Pete Pier, and top-rated beaches like Clearwater Beach and Fort De Soto for sun, sand, and relaxation.

## Beyond Tampa Bay: Orlando & The Space Coast

Orlando's top attractions include Walt Disney World, Universal Orlando, and SeaWorld. On the Space Coast, visit the Kennedy Space Center, watch rocket launches, or relax at Cocoa Beach.

When DP Davis developed Davis Islands, he formed a Davis Islands Yacht Club with Ceasar Irsch, his “Director of Activities” as Commodore. For several years (1925 & 1926) they sponsored a regatta for power boats, one class of which was known as The Tampa Babies – mahogany “725 Cubic inch runabouts”. Apparently, the Club ceased to function when the land bust occurred, but the idea didn’t die.

# History of the “Sailingest Club in the South”

In the early 1930’s, the sailors in Tampa had developed a sailboat class known as the “Tampa Bay 16-Footer”. There were no restrictions as to equipment, sails, hiking boards, etc., except that the boat could not exceed 16 feet. The sailboat became one of the first class boats raced in Tampa Bay and resulted in some of the keenest competition in our history. This group of sailors called themselves the Tampa Sailing Squadron.

In 1933 the group was chartered as The Tampa Sailing Squadron and by a coin toss, Bobbie C. Davis was “elected” the first Commodore. One of its early locations was the caretaker’s cottage behind the Davis Island Tennis Court.

In 1935 the Sailing Squadron moved to Marjory Park and on August 15, 1941 it changed its name to Davis Island Yacht Club. In 1935 the Club began the sponsorship of the first long distance coastal sailing race on the West Coast of Florida, the “Egmont Key Race”. It has been run annually since 1935 except for the war years.

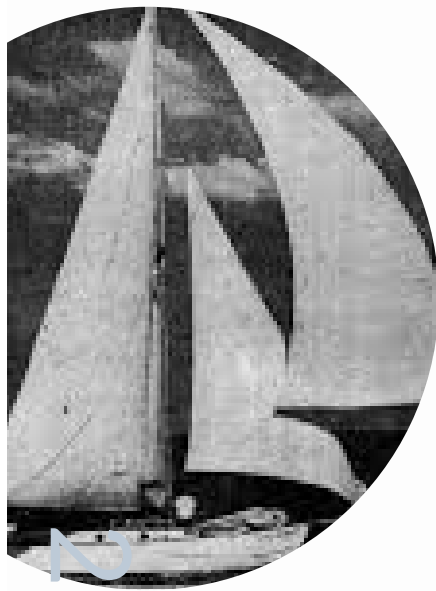
In 1942 the Club ceased to function actively as all the members had answered the call of their country to serve in World War II and the Clubhouse was leased to the Coast Guard. It was approximately 1946 before the Club began to function again.

In the mid 1940’s, Davis Island Yacht Club undertook the sponsorship of two major regattas-the Gasparilla Regatta and the Thanksgiving Regatta and today the Thanksgiving Regatta is one of the largest class regattas sponsored on the West Coast of Florida. In 1947, Lightning Fleet #164 constructed some docks in the Seaplane Basin and they were the first docks for sailing located there. In the late 1940’s DIYC had obtained some lots from the city on the end of Davis Island to eventually build a clubhouse on the location.

In 1955, after much negotiation with the City of Tampa, including legislation in Tallahassee in order for the land and water surrounding it be available for sailing activities, they traded those lots for a lease from the City of Tampa for the strip of land on the south end of the Seaplane Basin for a club house. After a bond issue to fund the construction, the Clubhouse was completed in 1956 on the southern tip of Davis Islands.

In 1960, after a second bond issue and retirement of the first bond issue, more construction was planned. The facilities at DIYC underwent a major expansion adding the present swimming pool, seawall and the initial docks at the Club as well as enlarging the kitchen facilities. Since then porches were added, the bar was expanded, the docks and dry slips were expanded, and two hoists were added, one with a floating dock. Over time, the Club's lease with the city was renegotiated and it now extends to 2041.

In the late 1980's and beyond, DIYC began hosting some new sailing events. In 1989, the Old Shoe Regatta began, a single-handed, no-class regatta. DIYC began hosting the Morgan Invasion in 2006, a regatta organized around boats designed by Charley Morgan. 2010 saw both the first Hangover Bowl, a regatta scheduled for January 1st, and the resurrection of the Tampa to Ft. Myers distance race. In 2013, DIYC hosted the first Hospice Cup in conjunction with the 28th Annual Morgan Invasion and raised \$100,000 in 2024.

In 2002 it became apparent that the existing Clubhouse would have to be replaced. As a result, a Building Committee was formed, plans were drawn up and financing was obtained. The existing Clubhouse was torn down in October 2003, a triple-wide trailer was moved in for temporary quarters and the groundbreaking ceremony for the new building was held on November 7, 2003. On October 22, 2004 the new Clubhouse was dedicated.



In 2005, construction on the Tiki Bar and the Regatta Room was completed. The Regatta room is used as a classroom, for regatta registration and as a meeting room. The Tiki Bar was removed after a few years and construction on the Regatta Bar and Pavilion area was completed in 2013. The extension for the bottom land lease on the DIYC property was signed in 2007 and a scoring hut was built out on the point. In 2015, a ramp for dinghy sailing on the Point was built and the floating docks were expanded and refurbished. Then in 2016, 8 slips on 'B' dock and 20 slips on 'C' dock were added along with power pods for electric and water.

DIYC member Jeff Linton received the 2007 US Sailing Rolex Yachtsman of the Year Award after winning the Lightning World Championship as well as other prestigious competitions. In 2011, The National Sailing Hall of Fame was formed with DIYC as one of the founding members.

In 2014, the first club launch Guardian was decommissioned and replaced with an Island Hopper 30 pilot house, Guardian II. The transom from Guardian, was mounted on the side of the clubhouse in December 2016 where the Tiki Bar stood. It is dedicated to the members that built her and the do-it-yourself spirit of the club.

# When You Arrive

## Vehicle Parking

During the regatta, vehicles must be parked outside the Club gates. Temporary access is permitted during launching prep (for bow numbers, decals, and mast setup) and during haul-out.



## Boat & Trailer Storage

The Club has 40 slips available, with registration for slips listed on the regatta notice board at Yacht Scoring.

- **North American Championship only:** Boats may arrive after November 23 and must depart by December 10, 2025. Limited storage is available on site; otherwise, boats must be stored off the property.
- **North American Championship and Winter Series competitors:** Boats may arrive after November 23 and remain for subsequent events.

## Trailer Storage

Trailer parking locations will be assigned prior to your arrival. Please follow volunteer directions when positioning trailers on site.

## Launching

Competitors will have access to the **two hoists** on site.

## Registration & Race Headquarters

Registration and race logistics will be located in the Regatta Room on the ground level facing the Bay.

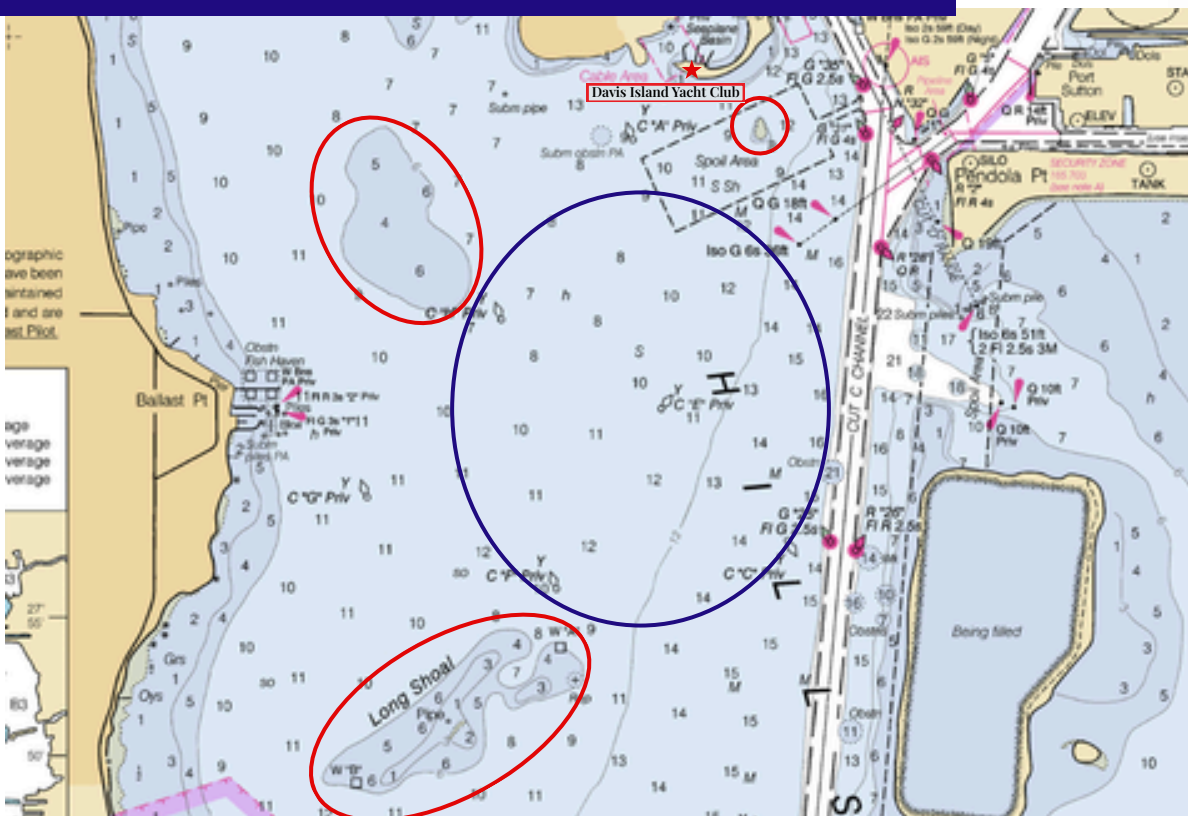
# Boat Parking & Sailing Area

Parking at the Club is limited. On-site trailer parking will be available for up to 40 boats on the north and south shore and 6 on the Point. All other vehicles must park outside the Club gates. Competitors and guests with handicap permits may park at the Clubhouse. Golf carts will assist with transporting you and your gear to your boat. Support boats may be launched at the public ramp just outside the Club grounds.

# Launching



Competitors will launch their boats using the two hoists available at the Club. Hoists must be operated by an experienced person, and no work may be done while a boat is suspended. Boats may be launched and left on the floating dock overnight throughout the regatta. Wash-down stations will be available during haul-out. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with parking, launching, haul-out, and any other needs.

Expect top-notch racing during the first week of December in Hillsborough Bay, with daytime temperatures in the low to mid-70s°F, mild evenings, and Gulf waters around 68°F—comfortable for all-day sailing. Steady 12–15 knot breezes provide exciting, competitive conditions, with occasional shifts adding tactical variety, while rare rain and mostly clear skies make for an ideal setting for the J/70 North American Championship.

# Medical Facilities and Safety

## Tampa General Hospital

Safety is a top priority for Davis Island Yacht Club and the J/70 North American Championship Organizing Committee. Tampa offers exceptional medical, fire, and rescue resources, ensuring rapid response and expert care both on and off the water.

Tampa General Hospital (TGH) — a private, not-for-profit academic medical center — is one of the most advanced facilities in West Central Florida, serving more than four million residents across a dozen counties. Located just five minutes from Davis Island Yacht Club, TGH provides immediate access to world-class emergency and trauma services.

Consistently recognized for excellence, Tampa General Hospital is ranked the #1 hospital in Tampa Bay and among the Top 50 hospitals nationwide in eight specialties, according to U.S. News & World Report (2024–2025). TGH is also rated “high performing,” placing it among the top 10% of U.S. hospitals in five additional specialties and twelve procedures and conditions.

Tampa Fire Rescue Station 17, located on Davis Islands minutes from the club, provides direct support to waterfront operations and is equipped with a rescue boat, marine-trained personnel, and multiple response vehicles.

Throughout the championship, safety boats and trained personnel will be stationed on the water, working in coordination with Tampa Fire Rescue, Hillsborough County EMS, and the U.S. Coast Guard to ensure a fast and effective response in any situation.

With experienced race management, proactive planning, and exceptional local resources, competitors and guests can be confident their safety is supported by one of the most capable emergency networks in the region.

The Tampa Bay area is exceptionally well-connected, making travel easy for competitors arriving from Mexico, Brazil, Sweden, Canada, and Bermuda.

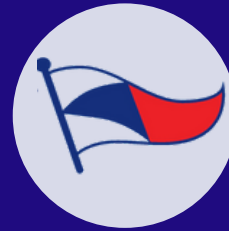

## Car Arrival

1. Exit I-275 at Ashley Street.
2. Proceed south to Kennedy Boulevard and turn right.
3. Proceed over the bridge to the first traffic light which is Hyde Park Avenue then turn left.
4. Continue straight to the Davis Islands bridge which turns into Davis Boulevard and veer right at the fork onto West Davis Boulevard.
5. Continue to the traffic circle.
6. Yield and continue straight onto Severn Avenue. The Yacht Club is at the terminus of Severn Ave.
